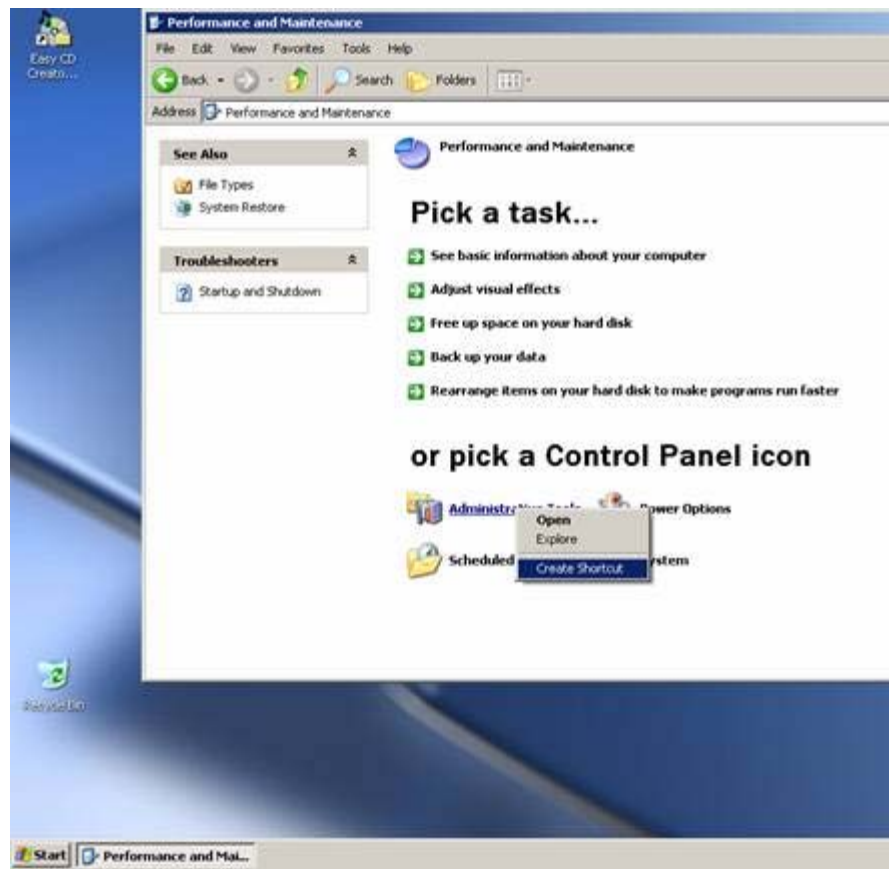

You can configure any program shortcut so that Windows prompts you for login time you double-click that shortcut.

TIP: This is an ideal solution for the Computer Management option in the Admin folder, which is what we are going to use.

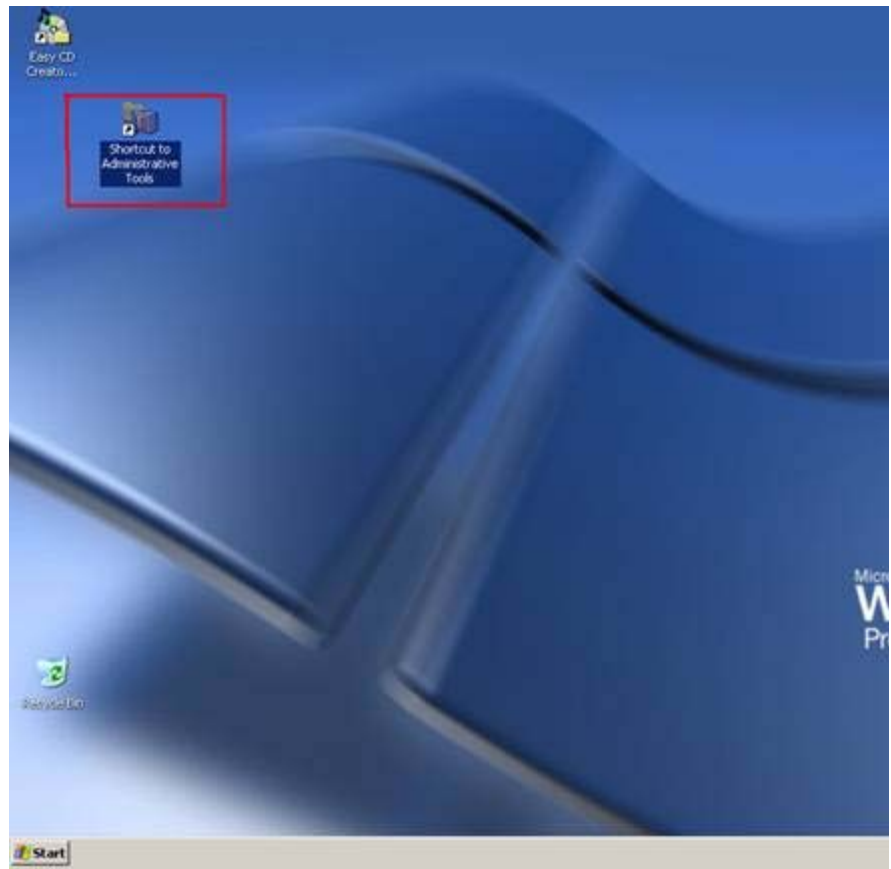
1. Create a shortcut on the desktop for the Computer Management Adminis Click **Start**, clicking **Control Panel**, clicking **Performance and Mainte** right click **Administrative Tools**.



2. Choose Create Shortcut and place it on the desktop. You will receive a message that Windows cannot create a shortcut here. Do you want the shortcut to be placed on the desktop instead?



3. Choose Yes.



4. Open the Administrative Tools Shortcut



5. Right click any of the tools. Let's see....which one should we choose? Oka



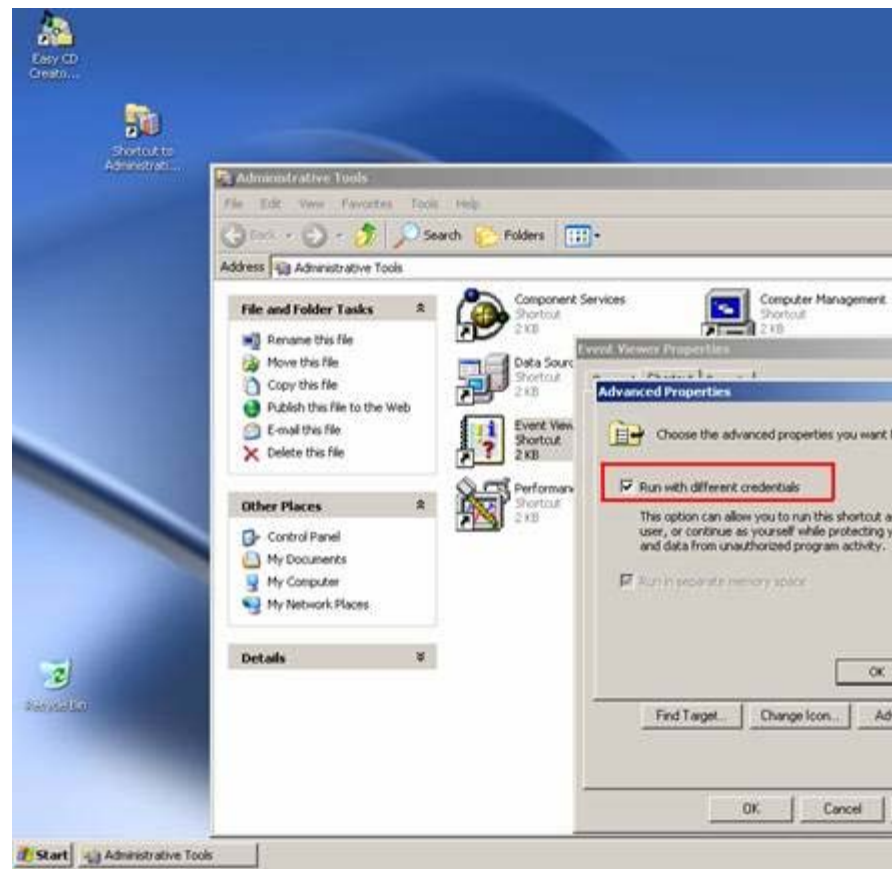
6. Choose Properties.



7. On the Shortcut tab, click the Advanced button.



8. Select the Run With Different Credentials check box. And then, you do so a change....Click OK...twice, no less!



9. To test this, double click Event Viewer.



TIP: Notice on the title bar that we have created the Event View shortcut command, in essence.
